Discussion Questions:

- 1. Why do you think it's important to say "I'm sorry" when we hurt someone's feelings? If you have a hard time saying, "I'm sorry," what else could you say?**
- 2. What does it mean to "own your actions" when apologizing? How can taking responsibility for what you did make a difference in how the other person feels?**
- 3. Why is it important to make sure your apology is sincere? What do you think happens if you apologize without meaning it? Can you think of a way to show sincerity through your actions?**
- 4. How do you think Tasha and Homer could have handled the situation differently before things got so heated? What could Tasha have done earlier to prevent hurting Homer's feelings?**
- 5. What does "Sorry is good, but change is better" mean? Why do you think it's important to not repeat the same mistake after apologizing? How can we show that we've changed after we apologize?**
